COUNTY NEGLECTS ITS TREES ON LEE HIGHWAY



PITS AND STEMS

Arlington County has decided not to pursue acquisition of the Goodman house next to Oak Grove Park on Quincy Street through eminent domain. The County is still interested in acquiring the property if the Goodmans wish to sell.

You may have noticed two garbage dumpsters at the rear of the Cherrydale Station (behind Cherrydale Hardware). They are NOT for public use. One is for cardboard only, but recently several individuals were seen tossing stuff (even mattresses) from their car into the cardboard Dumpster, and another person was seen rifling through the dumpster for old flowers and making a mess. The companies who use those dumpsters constantly police their employees to keep the area as clean as possible. Please do your part and report anyone throwing things in or taking things out of the dumpsters. Spilled trash not only is a blight on the neighborhood but also attracts vermin.

Maureen Ross reports that Cherrdyale business Koons Toyota continues to violate its use permit by allowing its dogwood trees in its planters to die every year. The CCA has filed a complaint, but please stop in and ask them to take care of their trees. Dunkin Donuts/Baskin Robbins is not keeping the sidewalk clean in front of its business, allowing weeds and litter to accumulate. Ask them to keep the sidewalk clean. If enough of us ask, they will listen!

COUNTY BOARD CANDIDATES DISCUSS CHERRYDALE LIBRARY

The Arlington County Board has considered closing Cherrydale Library twice in the past sixteen years (1992) and 1998). Citizens for Cherrydale Library (CCL), a non-partisan neighborhood volunteer group since 1998, has been querying County Board candidates for their written views about library funding, neighborhood libraries, and Cherrydale Library in particular. This year, on July 8, CCL posed the same three questions to candidates Barbara Favola and John Reeder. CCL promised the candidates that if they responded by August 16, their remarks would appear in the preelection issue of Sweet & Sour News and on the Cherrydale Citizens Association Website, cherrydale.net, and that CCL would submit their statements to the Arlington Sun Gazette. Both candidates sent responses, which appear below.

1. Do you support maintaining the current funding level of the Arlington County Department of Libraries?

Barbara Favola: Yes, I fully support maintaining the current funding level for the Arlington County Department of Libraries at a minimum. In the FY 2008 budget, I voted to increase funding to launch Arlington's On-Line Resource Network. This is an on-line catalogue of books available through the Library system. It is critical that Arlington provide Library services with state-of-the art technology and in a customer friendly manner. As your County Board member, I have committed the resources necessary to ensure that this happens. Moreover, I pledge to continue funding Arlington's Library system at a level that provides a very high-quality service.

John Reeder: Yes, I favor maintaining and possibly increasing the funding for county libraries. I would like the operating hours of libraries expanded rather than cut as occurred in the current FY2009 budget. The County Board has invested and is investing large sums of capital in

library buildings, and it makes no sense to me to cut the hours the libraries are open to the public. The library staff level has been flat for several years, while the county has built or expanded two neighborhood libraries (Westover and Shirlington). Why build a new building if you have to keep it closed? Excellent public libraries like public schools are the hallmarks of a great community, in my opinion.

2. What are your views on concentrating the County's library system in a smaller number of locations as opposed to maintaining the network of neighborhood libraries?

Barbara Favola: I enjoy and appreciate the County's neighborhood libraries. These libraries serve as gathering places for neighbors. They are safe and manageable places for young children to use. As a parent and former user of the Cherrydale Library, I completely understand why people are passionate about keeping this service in their neighborhood. When my family lived near the Cherrydale Library, my son and I

used to walk to the library to participate in the Children's Reading Program, much to my delight. The Cherrydale Library is truly a jewel and I am committed to keeping it open.

John Reeder: I strongly support neighborhood libraries, including the Westover Library close to where I live. I see neighborhood libraries as catering more to children and people living within walking distance, and that is an important element of our library system's functions.

3. As a member of the County Board, will you seek to close Cherrydale Library?

Barbara Favola: I really appreciate the Cherrydale Library and will not support closing it. When the County Board considered closing the Cherrydale Library in 1998, I strongly advocated keeping it open. If the idea of closing the Cherrydale Library ever surfaces again, I will do my best to ensure that the Board rejects the idea.

John Reeder: I will not seek to close the Cherrydale Library or any of the other existing branch librar-

BROMPTONS UPDATE



THE VIEW FROM MY PORCH - HOOKAHS AND **DOMINOS**

"What kind of place have you brought me to!" my wife recoiled in mock horror. Each of the dozen or so outdoor tables we walked past had four-to-six people not only playing cards, dominoes or checkers but also communally smoking a hookah, an ornate waterpipe. Actually, we were delighted. Here was Tarbouch, a restaurant on the edge of Cherrydale in the Pawn Shop/Rite-Aid mini-mall at the intersection of Lee and Kirkwood, offering good food, friendly service, an exotic atmosphere, and young folks thoroughly enjoying themselves in an alcohol-free environment.



Lebanon-born Ramzi Iskandar left his cushy job at the Four Seasons and started a three-worker carryout a few years ago. Last year he expanded into the long-time, but now-defunct, photo development shop (a victim of the digital age). Today, with 22 employees, Tarbouch challenges Lebanese Taverna and Pasha as the best in Middle-Eastern food in Arlington. He also has boldly decided to attract an often-denigrated market: smokers. No judgments here. Just a place for them to hang out at night while smoking is still legal.

The large interior is smoke-free; but outside, patrons order from among a wide selection of top-of-the-line tobaccos at \$10 a plug. You must be 18 to partake. (They check!) We sat outside munching fresh-made, garlicky falafel (with secret ingredients) on delicious, baked-daily-in-house pita; and despite a dozen or more pipes on-going, we were unaffected by smoke. It felt festive.

I asked about the competition in attracting diners since Ramzi does no advertising. He replied, "Competition drives excellence. Plus, we're open until 4 a.m. on weekends and nobody gets drunk. Word of mouth has done it so far." Welcome to the neighborhood! A Tarbouch, by the way, is a type of hat worn in Turkey and Morocco.




