

NC Petition: What am I signing?

Your neighbor(s) are proposing street related improvements, as detailed in the proposal. CCA rules require 70% affected block property owner support to be considered for nomination as a project. If selected by Cherrydale, the county will circulate additional petitions at various stages of the process that require 60% approval by linear frontage.

By signing this initial petition or the 1st official county petition you are only agreeing:

- you think the project is worth exploring;
- you understand, as a street project, the county may utilize its currently unused right-of-way abutting your property line;
- **you ARE NOT making any commitment at this time** to support actual construction. You may withdraw support anytime up to passage of the 2nd county petition.

Following a successful 1st petition, Arlington county will commission and engineering study and draw up a concept plan consistent with the improvement proposal. Once the plan is completed NC staff will present it at a meeting exclusively for affected property owners as well as discuss owner's concerns and attempt to remedy them, if possible.

Following this meeting, the 2nd county petition will be circulated. At this point block owners will vote to either approve or reject the county's construction plan. If approved the plan will be submitted to the county board via Neighborhood Conservation, for funding. If rejected, NC staff may try to make further changes to obtain the necessary block support, or withdraw the proposal from consideration.

All projects are paid 100% with Arlington County bond funds. There is never any direct cost to property owners at any stage of the process.
