THE FOURTEENTH ANNUAL CHERRYDALE PARADE

Look for signs in September for one of the great events that makes Cherrydale unique: our 14th Annual Cherrydale Parade. Marchers, spectators, people in costume, Scout troops, stroller brigades, dog walkers, rollerbladers, bikers, bands, groups, floats, fire trucks, decorated cars or trucks, antique vehicles, and businesses and residents are all welcome! Formation begins at 10:00 a.m., on the 1900 block of N. Randolph St., and we step out precisely at 11:00 a.m. Last year, the route went from Randolph Street to a right on 17th St., another right on Stafford St., a right on 21st St., a right on Randolph St. a left on 20th St., and then a right onto Quebec St., and continued to Scott Springston's and Kathy Holt's house, 1713 N. Quebec St. The fun continues at the Springston-Holt house, where there will be ice cream, a cherry "pie" eating contest, and awards for best decorated entry, best in the group, best pet, wackiest individual, best business, best decorated baby stroller, and best antique or cool vehicle. Thanks to Scott and Kathy for organizing and hosting this terrific family event.

COUNTY BOARD TO TAKE UP ACCESSORY DWELLING PROPOSAL JULY 19

Unless Cherrydalers, along with all citizens of Arlington, contact the County Board to persuade them that they should act otherwise, on Saturday, July 19th, the County Board is almost sure to approve a proposal to allow "accessory dwellings" or "ADs." The AD proposal would allow an owner-occupied, single-family homeowner to create a separate rental apartment within his or her home, with a separate entrance, separate kitchen, and separate utilities, in which two people unrelated to the homeowner can live. This zoning change could well change the density, character, and relative tax burden on every single family home in Arlington, and could have a special impact on Cher-

Come to the July 16 meeting of the Cherrydale Citizens Association to

learn more and to voice your opinion.

The County already allows a single family home to have a "family suite." A family suite can have two rooms, plus a bathroom and efficiency kitchen (with a total maximum size of up to 500 sq. ft.). It must have interior access to the rest of the house, it cannot have separate utilities, and can only be occupied by up to two people related to the occupants of the rest of the house.

The County's proposal is the result of a three-year process, and has been substantially modified since its inception. As currently proposed, an accessory could *not* be detached from the main house, could not be more than 750 sq. ft., would have to provide adequate parking, and would have to be recorded on the deed. The owner would have to live on the property,

would have to obtain a use permit, meet building codes, and provide access to code inspectors.

The potential advantages of allowing accessory dwellings is that it might provide increased below-market-rent housing opportunities, might provide extra income to homeowners, and might allow more people to "age in place" with live-in assistance from care providers.

The potential disadvantages include increased density, increased parking, and increased code enforcement problems. (What happens if the home owner goes overseas for his job or is transferred to another city? Must he or she sell their house or kick out their tenants? What if he or she is away six months of the year at a secondary residence?). The County claims to have addressed these issues, but Cherrydalers have special reason to be suspicious of the speed or effectiveness of the County's code enforcement (the Bromptons anyone?). It's also not clear that the County's proposal to limit the accessory dwelling to two tenants would comply with the Federal Fair Housing Act's prohibition against zoning discrimination on the basis of family status.

Additionally, it is not clear that the County has considered other effects of allowing accessory dwellings. Perhaps most significantly, it appears that the increased income producing potential for single family homes (whether or not a particular homeowner actually adds an accessory dwelling or not) would increase the tax assessment on all single family homes, and thus increase their relative tax burden compared to duplexes, townhouses, condos, etc. The added value of accessory dwellings would also appear to pose a special threat to Cherrydale, as they would seem to provide an added incentive to tear down Cherrydale's older, often more affordable, smaller homes and replace them with new, larger, and much more expensive homes that have room for accessory dwellings.

Cherrydalers should also be aware that the Housing Commission wants a far broader Accessory Dwelling zoning change. Most significantly, the Housing Commission believes that ADs should be allowed in separate buildings, such as garages.

The bottom line is that Cherrydalers need to come to the CCA meeting to learn more about this proposal and to voice their opinions, and to contact the County Board directly to make sure they have considered all impacts of this proposal before they pass it.







LETTER FROM A NEIGHBOR OF AN ILLEGAL ACCESSORY DWELLING

Editors' Note: The Following Does Not Necessarily Represent the Views of the Cherrydale Citizens Association or Its Officers. It is the Opinion of a Cherrydaler Who Has Lived Next Door to an Illegal Accessory Dwelling and Therefore Offers a Unique Perspective for Other Cherrydalers to Consider:

Dear Neighbors,

Please consider signing the online petition located at: http://www.petitiononline.com/pupi1031/petition.

As an Arlington homeowner and not a representative of Cherrydale, I am adamantly opposed to any proposal to allow by right or by guaranteed permit, the creation of an accessory dwelling in a single family neighborhood. I have lived next door to such a home and it absolutely detracts from the character of single family neighborhoods.

I am not xenophobic. I am not anti immigrant. My wife is originally from Central America. I am simply against the completely ludicrous idea(s) being railroaded through the County process. The arguments for the proposals center around making property more affordable for seniors who already own them and for moderate to low income folks who cannot currently afford to purchase or rent in Arlington.

Please follow me on this: If you are a senior and already own your property, and assuming no catastrophic financial event such as the loss of a job, the affordability of the property is only affected by the current value and the significantly increased tax liability we have all experienced. Arlington, however, already provides for complete tax forgiveness (not deferment) for people with less than certain household income levels (even if they have a million dollars in an IRA).

We don't need ADs to assist most of Arlington's senior citizens. As far as making property more affordable to people who want to move to the County, the AD proponents are completely wrong. In general an income producing property is more valuable and therefore more costly to acquire than a non income producing

property.

Think, about it: Two typical Arlington colonials for sale each right next door to each other. One of them has converted part of the house into a complete separate living unit. The other has not. The AD unit in the garage rents for \$800-\$1600 per month. It is highly likely the property with the converted garage will sell for more, all other details being the same. If the property is more costly to purchase, how does that make it more affordable?

Lastly, the only way to make housing more affordable in Arlington, is to decrease the value. While I do not like paying the much higher taxes with which we all have been saddled, I certainly don't want the County Board taking any action which may decrease the value of my property. The fact is that some people can afford to live here and some cannot. Socialistic economic policies may sound good, but remember the County must take something from you and me in order to provide it to someone else.
