The County Board will hold a hearing on the Blighted Property Ordinance violations on May 17, 2008 heginning at 9:00am in Room 307, 2100 Clarendon Blvd.

Cherrydale Citizens Association President Brian Bonnet suggests contacting the County Manager and the County Board asking that they continue to push this demolition with all appropriate speed.

As we all know, Ed Pete, developer of the Bromptons at Cherrydale, abandoned construction on the last building of his development on Lee Highway long ago. The developer abandoned the building because of major structural issues discovered



during the construction. As a result, the County Inspection Services Division has let the original building permit expire. The developer informed the County in January 2007 of his intent to dismantle the existing work to the foundation and re-erect the building. Accordingly, the developer applied for a demolition permit on February 16, 2007. Unfortunately, the County declined to issue the demolition permit because the developer failed to submit certain required documents. So the building continued to sit abandoned.





or repair the building within 60 days of the receipt of the notice. Rather than do either of these, the developer instead filed an appeal request before the Building Code Board of Appeals. That appeal was heard Wednesday, March 19, and the Board upheld the order. However, the State Building Code Board of Appeals allowed the Ed Peete Company an additional 120 days to begin the demolition work. We should not be surprised if the developer appeals the Board's decision in the courts to delay having to demolish as long as possible.

Concurrent with the notice of Unsafe Building, the County invoked the blight provisions of the County Code and gave notice to the developer in January of 2008. The notice required the applicant to provide a plan for corrective measures within 30 days. The applicant submitted the plan, but County staff were unable to approve the plan because it was incomplete. Again, the developer can probably also appeal any blight order in the courts in order to buy more time.

- The Planning Commission will hold a hearing on the alleged Blighted Property Ordinance violations on May 7, 2008 beginning at 7:00PM in Room 307, 2100 Clarendon Blvd.
- The County Board will hold a hearing on the alleged Blighted Property Ordinance violations on May 17, 2008 beginning at 9:00AM in Room 307, 2100 Clarendon Blvd.
- If the owner does not voluntarily demolish or repair the building, the County has the option of demolishing the building and putting a lien on the property to recover the cost of demolition.







The County has been working to put utilities underground along Lee Highway for ten years but doesn't seem to care where they put the new monster-sized utility boxes. The County has placed the foundation for one box right along the sidewalk in front of 3200 Lee Highway, inviting graffiti, and leaving no room for shade trees. They claim that it would cost \$63,000 to move it now, but \$13,000 to build a retaining wall if they leave it where it is.


