

NEIGHBORHOOD CONSERVATION NEWS

RANDOLPH STREET PROJECT FUNDED

Congratulations and thanks to Phil Vitale, Block Captain for the Randolph St. Neighborhood Conservation project. Phil and his block (between 16th Pl. and 15th St.) patiently waited years to get curb, gutter, sidewalk, and new full depth paving. Phil's yeoman effort organizing the block and obtaining the many required signatures paid off and the project was recommended for funding at the Spring NC Funding Session. Phil's work will make walking to W&L and Ballston a little safer, and driving down Randolph a little less scary.

KENMORE AND 20TH STREET PROJECT

Cherrydale's next scheduled NC project is Kenmore St./20th Street. CCA members voted to make this its NC project at last March's meeting. Well over 60 percent of homeowners have show support for the project, and the county has begun surveying in order to "scope" the cost of the project. If the overall size of the project, or the county's required add-ons (e.g., redoing existing sidewalks), raise the price tag high enough, the NC Committee may require the project to be funded in two phases. If that turns out to be the case, the CCA would have a second vote on the second phase of the project.
