Bromptons Condo Building Update

The Bromptons Condo Building is going forward! The recession made it cheaper to rebuild the Bromptons than to demolish it. So Bromptons developer Ed Peete settled the lawsuit brought by the County. Pete submitted drawings in September for the repair and remediation and completion of construction of the building. The County reviewed the drawings and returned them to Pete on October 12 with a summary of the changes required. Pete revised the drawings and resubmitted them on October 27. Pete has to begin construction within 10 days of receiving the building permit.

In recent weeks, Peete has conducted tests on the building, has removed the exterior balconies (which will be replaced at a later time), and is in the process of installing new windows in the building. More activity is expected in the coming weeks.

CANDIDATES NIGHT A SUCCESS

By the time you read this, we will all know who won the races for the Arlington County Board and for the 48th District in the Virginia House of Delegates. But on October 21st, residents of Cherrydale, Dover-Crystal, Donaldson Run, and Maywood turned out to hear what candidates had to say about the issues facing our local and state govern-

ments – everything from widening I-66 to the School Board budget to whether Virginia should opt out of a health care public option, assuming there was one. Some 50 people attended the first hour where County Board candidates Jay Fisette and John Reeder answered questions collected from the audience. About 30 people attended the second hour with Bob Brink and Aaron Ringel, candidates for the House of Delegates. Candidates Night was a true joint effort. The volunteers of the Cherrydale Volunteer Fire Department (CVFD) allowed us to use the hall in the firehouse and Chief Scott Pardi set up the microphones. Mike Green of Donaldson Run, ably assisted by 11-year old Cherrydaler Nicholas Kampeas, used stop watches to keep the candidates brief in their answers; and Mike rang a cow bell if they exceeded the allotted time. CCA President Maureen Ross and Dover-Crystal President John O'Reilly sorted through the questions that the audience kept offering up on pieces of paper throughout the evening and posed a good and challenging variety to the candidates. It was a neighborly and informative meeting. The other neighborhood associations were very pleased to piggyback on Cherrydale's effort, were impressed with our historic firehouse, and have already suggested we host another forum next year.

A WIN-WIN FOR CHERRYDALE AND KOONS TIRE SHOP

Thanks to the CCA's determination to address the forever dying and dead potted trees in front of Koons Tire Shop on Old Lee Hwy across from Koons Toyota, County inspectors have finally found that the tire shop was in violation of its use permit requiring the shop to maintain landscaping. Over the years, both the CCA and Koons had repeatedly sought to plant trees rather than put them in planters, but the County permit continually required planters because County staff simply assumed that the land owners would not want trees planted. But now the County has relented and the permit will require Koons to replace the planters with landscape strips by April. In addition, Koons has to submit a maintenance agreement to the County and is subject to a review before the County Board in six months to monitor progress and citizen complaints. Thanks to **Roger Merletti** for monitoring the site and serving the CCA's liaison to Koons, and to other neighbors for their feedback as well.

SIDEWALK, CURB, AND GUTTER AT LAST FOR 17TH ST. EAST OF QUINCY ST.

Neighbors living on the 17th St. east of Quincy St. have been asking for curb, gutter and sidewalk for over 12 years to address drainage problems, but the street's small size and light traffic made it unlikely to qualify for funds from the Neighborhood Conservation program. As it turns out, the street's proximity to Cherry Valley Park made a difference.

As a result of our continuing volunteer projects in the Cherry Valley Nature Area, the County is using its own funds for a drainage project along 17th St. from Quincy St. to Pollard St. The County will also be installing a sidewalk on the north side of the street. Construction is expected to begin in Summer 2010, and should last two months.

Thanks goes to all those who've brought attention to this area, including CCA officers, the Cherrydale Parks Committee and especially Cherrydalers Susan Hennessey and Jill Schamberger. Never give up!

CLEAN UP OF PARKING GARAGE AREA AT QUINCY AND 15TH ST.

In response to Scott Springston and Loretta Cleek's discussion at the September CCA meeting, CCA President Maureen Ross investigated and filed complaints with County about the condition of the land around the parking garage on the corner of Quincy St. and 15th St., which had become a place of overgrowth, refuse and a possible campsite for homeless people.

We received an impressive response from Parks and Recreation. Parks has had to reduce services, but due to the number of reports received, the County issued a work order for a clean up of debris and vegetation.

Suspected homeless camp sites were dealt with by the police. The officer who came out to investigate did not see any homeless people but did fill out a report to have the broken fence fixed and the debris removed.

The end result is a pretty fair clean up thus far. We will need reports from citizens to monitor progress. In this case, the volume of complaints really got quick and effective action. Let's stay on top of this.

SAINT AGNES SCHOOL NAMED BLUE RIBBON WINNER

The U.S. Department of Education has chosen Cherrydale's Saint Agnes Catholic School as one of its 2009 Blue Ribbon Schools. The Blue Ribbon Program honors public and private schools of every grade level that are either academically superior or that demonstrate dramatic gains in student achievement. 
