Help Us Envision a More Connected Cherrydale

Join us at our next meeting of the Cherrydale Citizens Association on **February 21** to learn about our efforts to reconnect Cherrydale to our neighboring communities and help us envision how those connections can look.

The CCA is working with the Lee Highway Alliance to move Lee Highway away from a "cars-first" design that speeds commuters through Arlington to a series of interconnected neighborhood main streets focused on Arlington residents and businesses.

Cherrydalers love to visit shops in and around the Lyon Village Shopping Center. But too few of us walk or bike there because of the narrow, unlit sidewalks





underneath I-66, and the long stretch of sidewalks hemmed in by huge retaining walls. We can change this. First, we hope to light the underpass and turn it into a destination

Ice Cream Social with the Cherrydale Volunteer Fire Department

Join us at our next meeting of the Cherrydale Citizens Association on **February 21** for an Ice Cream Social with the Cherrydale Volunteer Fire Department. Learn about their long history with Cherrydale and their current mission and challenges they face.

Founded 120 years ago, by twelve Cherrydalers, the CVFD is the oldest fire department in Northern Virginia. The volunteers built the current fire house in 1919. Paid firefighters from Arlington County were stationed alongside the volunteers from 1940 until 2011. Today the volunteers use Light and Air 103 and Utility 103 to respond to fires, emergency medical calls, hazardous material incidents, and other rescues. Additionally, CVFD's members provide supplemental staffing on career apparatus throughout the county and for special events, like the Marine Corps Marathon and Wreaths Across America.

The CCA has long been active in raising funds for the CFVD, and the CVFD has a long tradition of joining parades as well as hosting dances, movies, bingo nights, and visits from Santa. To help defray costs, it rents out its Social Hall to individuals and groups for birthday parties, meetings, classes and activities. You can rent it out, too. for walkers and bikers. Second, we need to reclaim the retaining walls, and maybe even an unnecessary traffic lane, and turn them into a feature.

This is where you come in! We need input on what this will look like in Cherrydale. The NoMa Business Improvement District in DC is leading the way for us on lighting. NoMA is hiring an artist to light the railroad underpasses that divide that neighborhood. The CCA is already moving forward with the LHA and VDOT to explore our own light installation under I-66. We need your ideas about what our under-bridge lighting project could look like. Do we keep our costs down and follow NoMa's lead? Do we find our own artists and create our own design? How do we incorporate a design that accounts for sidewalks on both sides of the street and the bike path?

Similarly, we need your ideas for reclaiming the huge stretches of sidewalks that pass underneath the bridge and continue along the concrete retaining walls. Fortunately the County has redesigned the traffic signals and cross walks at I-66. It's a great start, but what else can we do? Do we turn the walls into painted murals? Hang other art installations on the walls? Or maybe we reclaim one of the unnecessary driving lanes with concrete planters and industrial-scale art installations?

While always cost conscious, we want to be bold. We invite you to think about what you've seen in other parts of Arlington, other parts of the DC area, and other cities around the country and the world that you think could

work along this stretch of Lee Highway. Lots of other communities have, without breaking the bank, found creative ways to reclaim spaces for walkers and bikers that were originally designed with only cars in mind. We can do it, too.

Both play areas will be oak-tree themed. The 5- to 12-year-old play area will also have a rope climbing structure. Your kids will love it.

We want to thank Cherrydaler Debby Cook for her tireless work in trying to keep the County moving forward and for watching over the new trees the County planted. Debby's work is a testament to what any Cherrydaler can get done as long as they persist. We can't wait to visit the new playground. Longtime Cherrydale Resident David Hunter Passes Away at Age 100

David Hunter died peacefully in his sleep in his home—which was his wish—on January 16, 2018. He was sharp and quick-witted till the end.

Born on July 25, 1917, in Eugene, Oregon, Dave graduated from University High School in 1935 and from the University of Oregon in Eugene in 1939. Drafted into WWII, Hunter started as a private and made his way up to Lt. Colonel. He joined the CIA as a cryptologist in 1946. David and his wife, Lucille (Cooke) met while he was on assignment with the Signal Corps at Arlington Hall, and they married in 1945. Lucille passed away in 1988. Four children, Cheryl, Stephen, Karen, and Jan survive them.

Dave and Lucille bought their little brick house at the end of Kenmore Street in 1956, and, except for a few years in the 60s when the family moved to Okinawa, they lived there for the rest of their lives. Some of the older Cherrydalers might remember trick-or-treating at the Hunter's house. There was often a real-live witch sitting by the door, who terrified the kids as she moved ever so slightly when they knocked!

A service is planned for Sunday, February 25 at 1:00 pm at the First Baptist Church of Washington, DC.


