# CONFESSIONS OF CHERRYDALE VOLUNTEER by Tom Korns

You may be wondering what happened to the Christmas wreaths that are usually on the Cherrydale entry signs during the Holiday season. I totally forgot them and didn't think about it until nearly New Years. The reason shows what a slave to routine we can all get. Generally my cue is breaking out my house decorations a couple of weeks before Christmas. I run around and put up the wreaths and go home and do the harder job of stringing lighted garlands and wreaths on my porch and balcony railings. Only this year I painted the house well into November and ended up deciding to replace the railings rather than doing quicker repairs. Then Kathy and I took off for London and India December 12th not returning to Christmas chores till the 23rd. Did get a tree up (sure get cheap about that time), but passed on jury-rigging the house decorations. So no cue, no Cherrydale wreaths.

I've been sporadic about the other two annual Sign decorations. For Valentines Day I finally found good big red mylar balloons only to have most of them shredded in a wind blown ice storm. # **NEWS ABOUT CHERRYDALERS**

Bob McAtee, Maywood's oldest resident and the person who has lived in the neighborhood the longest, is back at home now after spending several weeks first in the Arlington Hospital and then at the Cherrydale rehab center. At 95, he's defied the odds. He has almost constant care these days, but he is somewhat mobile with a walker, and his mind is clear. He's interested in helping as he can in celebrating the centenary of Maywood. Rumor is that he's lived at his house at 3200 N. 22nd Street since 1916! Some of you know he's a fount of information about Maywood over the decades. He likes to tell stories of the old days. He welcomes visitors: late morning or the afternoon seem to be best.

Congratulations to Cherrydaler **Ray Caputo**, who works at the Army Topographic Engineering Center and received the U.S. Geospatial Intelligence Foundation's Geospatial Intelligence Achievement Award in October. Ray was recognized for his exceptional support, promotion, and development of GeoPDF. GeoPDF allows soldiers to print easy-to-read maps "on demand" and access detailed, up-to-date information.

# **BROMPTONS UPDATE**

And so the abandoned Bromptons condo building remains . . . In September 2008, the County Board authorized the County Attorney to institute all necessary legal action to compel compliance with the order of Building Official and to recover any costs incurred by the County in doing so. The County Attorney filed a Complaint for Injunctive Relief in the Circuit Court of Arlington County in October.

As of today, the court has not set a date to hear this case. At the County Board meeting on December 13, the Board deferred consideration of declaring this Bromptons a blighted property, which would allow the County to demolish the building without going through the courts, until the June Board meeting. This is because if the County were to demolish the building without going through the courts, the likelihood is very limited that that the County would recover the cost of demolition. And so the abandoned Bromptons condo building remains . . .

# THE VIEW FROM MY PORCH - MAY YOU LIVE IN

## INTERESTING TIMES

It's too cold to sit on the porch, and I'm finally putting Josephine, our wooden cow, in the garage before the snows begin; but I muse, porch-like, on the following:

When my first wife, the mother of my two daughters, and I wanted to get married 45 years ago, Virginia and 18 other states had made it against the law. We were of different races: She was Black; I was White. (I wonder about capitalizing those two words.)



Those anti-miscegenation laws legitimized other forms of discrimination too, making it very difficult, for example, to find housing.

We not only had to go into Washington DC to get married, we also had a hard time getting anyone in the entire metro region to rent us an apartment.

Three years later in 1967, a Supreme Court decision triggered by a Virginia couple's suit ruled such laws unconstitutional, and as we know, subsequent decisions and laws outlawed school segregation, opened voting booths, and generally aimed us toward a less color-based society. No longer would we get turned away at a motel or come across a restaurant with a separate Colored Entrance. The couple's name was Loving; who says irony is dead?

And now we have a Black president. Wow!

P.S. She and I have since remarried, but our large blended family spends most holidays and some vacations together; it works well for us. My daughters and their children are proud of us. My younger daughter, Tara, once offered the following toast at a large Christmas dinner gathering here on Pollard Street: "To all the parents you can get!"

May we all continue to live in interesting times.
