# Cherrydale Library at 50

The Cherrydale Library (2190 North Military Road) celebrated its 50th anniversary on Saturday, July 9, 2011. Patrons of the Library were greeted by music, activities for children, and local community leaders, including Congressman James Moran and Bob Brink, District 48's representative in the Virginia House of Delegates.

Judson Gardner, one of the architects of the Library, described the problems he faced in the late 1950s trying to design a quality library on the available lot. Elenor Hodges, the Executive Director of Arlingtonians for a Clean Environment, recognized the Library's successful efforts to "become green," and historian Kathryn Holt Springston put the Library's story into the context of the last century of Cherrydale's history.

Representative James P. Moran congratulated Cherrydale's residents on their support for the Library and noted how important it was for parents to read to their children. Suzanne and Greg Embree organized the ceremony, and Greg introduced the speakers. See page 3 for a photograph.

# **New Fire Station Number 3**

\*\*\*August: There will be a summer break in August. The September book will be given out at the July discussion.




