


LEE HIGHWAY UNDERGROUNDING UPDATE

The following update was sent by Assistant County Manager Shannon Flanagan Watson as a result of a meeting between the CCA and the County Manager Barbara Donnellen, Shannon and engineer Mike Collins. At that meeting Maureen gave each a folder documenting the communications about Lee Hwy undergrounding from 2001 to present. Three themes were highlighted: 1) Constant delays in the process including communication issues; 2) Construction related problems (debris, decay, unsightliness) and 3) Pollard St. entry; with the phone pole blocking full access and pedestrian safety issues. Photos were provided to further demonstrate the depth of these problems over a prolonged period of time (10 years and counting).

Having established why we are concerned, we moved on to agree this project needs to be accelerated where possible; to establish time lines/due dates for each step in the process; and to keep the lines of communication open. For the later it was agreed County would supply us an update for each newsletter and to contact us immediately when there looks to be a problem or significant delay. There are times we might intercede where the County cannot.

In the meantime I would like to apologize for the state of the article I sent in on Lee Hwy's History in the last newsletter. Apparently I submitted one of my drafts in error and having submitted it so late, there was no time for editing. My Fault! I will have it posted on our website for reference (because it documents the history of communications). Here then is the article submitted by the county: The Cherrydale Lee Highway Revitalization Program was designed to bring aesthetic and functional improvements to Cherrydale's busy Lee Highway corridor. (see next column)



Phase I (I-66 to Monroe St)

Dominion Virginia Power (DVP) has scheduled a preconstruction meeting for the week of February 21 on the first phase of the utility undergrounding project. Remaining construction, which consists of electrical work that involves little or no excavation, is expected to begin in March (depending on the availability of DVP crews) and will take place in stages. The project is scheduled for completion later this year (2011). Some traffic impacts are expected as DVP and contractor crews must work in the manholes and on the existing utility poles.

Phase II (N Oakland St to west of N Quincy)

Design work for the second phase of utility undergrounding is proceeding on schedule. In mid-January, the County directed its consultant to accelerate the design process by splitting the remaining design into two segments and working on both segments concurrently. The goal of the parallel design process is to compress the schedule. The County anticipates receiving a preliminary design for the duct bank alignments and configurations in early March, and at that time, re-evaluate the design and construction schedule.

County crews completed the interim reconfiguration of the Pollard Street and Lee Highway intersection during the week of January 24th. The current design provides approximately three feet of additional width. The permanent intersection configuration will be completed once the existing pole is removed during the second phase of utility undergrounding, which is expected to be completed in November 2013.

Finally, the County is working with the developer of the Bromptons project to implement an interim treatment for the sidewalk and streetscape in front of the new building. The new curb and sidewalk alignment have been constructed, but the old curb line cannot be removed until the utility undergrounding is completed. The preliminary design includes:

- a wide utility strip,
- several connections between the existing sidewalk along Lee Highway, and,
- a paver sidewalk adjacent to the building.

Commitment

Arlington County is committed to aggressively pursuing the completion of this program. Milestones for the critical utility undergrounding Phase II project have been developed and posted on the County web site to help further this goal and will be used to track progress during the final stages of this program. Bi-monthly updates will be shared with the Cherrydale Civic Association through this newsletter.

NEIGHBORHOOD CONSERVATION PROJECT FUNDING

Cherrydale's three funded Neighborhood Conservation (NCprojects are scheduled for construction this year, and as early as this spring. The contract bid process for 18th St. concluded in February and the County Board should approve this month or next. Construction will start shortly afterwards.

The final design process is ongoing for Kenmore St. and county staff expects to be able to start work in the summer after approval from near neighbors. Randolph St. is also expected to break ground in late summer barring any delays in the construction queue.

CCA also submitted a Missing Links sidewalk project to NC for the corner of 20th Rd. and N. Randolph St. which was approved. That project will likely be completed this spring. At the November and January CCA meetings, as well as the Sweet & Sour newsletters for those months, a call for NC Micro Project idea submissions was made. The CCA imposed deadline was February 14 and the only idea officially submitted was by Patricia Petty for new play equipment for Cherrydale Park. She or her husband Bill will discuss her idea at the March CCA meeting and ask for support to forward to NC for consideration as a future Micro Project. It's a great proposal and just the kind of idea that Micro Project program was established. Thanks Patricia.
