The Arlington County Board, last month, approved \$795,000 for the Oakgrove Park Neighborhood Conservation (NC) project. The improvements, funded by the 2014 voter-approved Capital Improvement Program bond, include updating the playground equipment, replacing the gazebo, and installing a

replacing the gazebo, and installing a rain garden. The project is not connected to the current ADA upgrades being completed now. The start date will be announced in a future edition of SSN.



Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety in Cherrydale

The County is working on making Cherrydale a safer place to walk and bike! Specifically, they are working to put in a signal to help people walking and biking across Quincy Street at 15th Street North, where the ramp to the Custis Trail meets a crosswalk across Quincy. They are also considering a signal to help people walking and biking across Lee Highway at North Nelson Street, near the Safeway.

County staff is considering a rectangular rapid flash beacon (RRFB) for the Quincy location. An RRFB is a set of flashing yellow lights usually on the side of the road that is activated when a person walking or biking pushes a button on the side of the street, alerting drivers that someone wants to cross.

Fourth of July Party another great Cherrydale success. We need your help with finding a location, arranging activities and events, finding sponsors for food and supplies and the like.



residents' responses to a 194-question survey, expresses Cherrydale's developmental vision, community desires, and infrastructure needs for the next decade. Completion and acceptance of the



plan also offers Cherrydale NC project "bonus points" to obtain funding quicker than if the points were not available.

Speaking of which, Cherrydale neighbors have until April 7 to submit their street improvement, park, or beautification proposal (and petition for street projects) for Cherrydale's next NC project. At the May 20th CCA meeting qualified proposals will be presented for consideration with a vote will follow. The winner will be submitted as our #1 priority project.


A similar signal exists on Columbia Pike and South Frederick Street.

crossWalk beacon, or HAWK signal. HAWK signals hang over the roadway, and have both red and yellow lights.
