

Scott puts up several huge signs (and lots of little signs) advertising the event two weeks before, so cut-through traffic is aware of the upcoming event. Neighborhood Conservation Project Update

Last January a call was made to the community for Arlington Neighborhood Conservation (NC) project proposals — with one to be voted on at the May 20 CCA meeting as our "#1 priority project." Past Cherrydale projects include the power station wall on Lee Hwy, new paving, curb, gutter, sidewalks and street lights on parts of Stafford, Randolph, and 18th St., and sidewalk and street lights on Kenmore St. Without NC projects like these, our community would be less safe to drive, walk, and bike around, and also wouldn't look as good. It's not enough to say they are vital but this is a short article.

This round Rosemary O'Neil proposed, and got qualified for a vote, new sidewalk and street lights for Monroe St. between

17th and 19th, not far from Science Focus Elementary School, as well as other key neighborhood destination points. The chief goal of the project is to provide safer access for all on this high traffic volume portion of Monroe St., as well as connecting side streets. The new sidewalk is proposed on the west side of the street.



Since no other proposals qualified for voting, Rosemary will give a brief presentation on her concept, based on discussions with NC staff, followed by a vote of approval for the project. Once approved by CCA the project NC will be notified it is Cherrydale's "#1 priority project." Come out and show your appreciation to Rosey and support her for doing all the footwork on this and helping to improve our community.

Because of the outstanding effort put forth by Cherrydale's NC Plan Update team, led by Maureen Ross, Cherrydale will have enough bonus "NC points" that should propel this project to the top of the funding list no later than next spring, and possibly this December. And then it will be time to begin again. So as you travel the community keep NC in mind because another call for project proposals will be made in short time.

5. How does this project benefit the entire Cherrydale neighborhood and not just the street and block proposed:

North Monroe Street is one of Cherrydale's busy through-streets, connecting Lee Highway and the Maywood neighborhood to the north with the Ballston-Virginia Square neighborhood to the south.

Between 17th and 19th Streets on North Monroe, there is no contiguous sidewalk on the east side of the street. On the west side of the street, there is contiguous sidewalk; however, utility poles obstruct passage, making the sidewalk inaccessible. Individuals in wheelchairs and pedestrians with strollers must maneuver into the street, and pedestrians in small groups or carrying grocery bags often do, in order to get around the poles. Further, several of the existing street lights are damaged and no longer function properly.

North Monroe is very busy with both vehicle and pedestrian traffic, particularly at rush hour, but also during non-rush hours and on weekends. There are numerous destinations within walking distance reached via this section of North Monroe. Points south include Science Focus and Hayes Park (within less than a mile), the YMCA, and further, the restaurants, shops, and mertor stations at Clarendon and Ballston. Points north include school bus stops for Taylor, Key, and Swanson public schools, the Metro bus stop, as well as the offices, shops, and restaurants on Lee Highway. In addition, this section of North Monroe is traversed by many neighbors simply out for a walk or exercising with their family members and pet dogs.

Improving the sidewalk and street lights between 17th and 19th Streets will make the street safer and more accessible for everyone who uses it.

6. Please have neighbors of the proposed project sign the attached petition. A minimum of 70% of block owners (one vote per address), as registered on the property's deed, must sign the petition in order to be able to be nominated as a Cherrydale NC project. The 70% threshold is for the nominating round only. (The official NC petitions require 60% approval based on linear footage of the property adjacent to the project.)

I. Research of Alignon NCAC as its number one priority project. I agree if the project is submitted to NCAC that I will volumeter as block captain, or if I cannot serve, to find another block neighbor for the position.



path circumnavigating the park, new stairs at the 15h Street entrance, small bleachers, several benches, a new sprinkler system and new sod on the soccer field, and many newly planted trees. We'll also have some County staff on hand to talk about the upcoming Phase Two improvements—Cherrydale's current Neighborhood Conservation project. Arlington County Neighborhood Conservation projects are paid for with special voter-approved bonds that are designated for infrastructure improvements like parks and sidewalks.




Phase Two of the Oak Grove NC Project will include new playground equipment for kids aged 5 to 12, new seating areas, a water

fountain, and other great things.

We're hoping to have some great activities for kids—maybe a scavenger hunt or maybe a moon bounce. And we will have a vote for our next NC project — a new, wider, safer sidewalk on Monroe Street between 17th Street and 19th Street. This stretch of Monroe Street is the major pedestrian access to Science Focus School, Hayes Park, and the Virginia Square Metro. But the current sidewalk is only 18- to 20-inches wide in places because of utility poles and stone walls. It forces people in wheelchairs and many strollers into the street. The new sidewalk will be wide enough that all people will actually be able to use it.

Finally, we need to begin brainstorming about future NC projects. We are going to get a lot of them because we recently updated our Cherrydale NC Plan, which gave us a bunch of bonus points to use on future NC Projects. These ideas, and eventually these projects, come from you, our fellow Cherrydalers.

We look forward to seeing you in Oak Grove Park. If the skies darken, we'll met at our usual spot, the upstairs of the Cherrydale Volunteer Fire Department. Otherwise, we'll see you in the park!
