



Stratford Middle School Update

Arlington Public Schools (APS) plans to renovate the building that currently houses the HB Woodlawn and Stratford programs and convert it to a neighborhood middle school to open in Fall 2019 (HB and Stratford



programs will move to a new school being built at the Wilson site near Rosslyn). The Building Level Planning Committee (BLPC) for the new Stratford Middle School has had 10 meetings over the last several months to discuss site concept design options. The BLPC consists of representatives from the neighborhoods surrounding the school (including Cherrydale), as well as APS staff and PTA representatives.

The next BLPC meeting is tentatively scheduled for September 14 (though that date is subject to change) and community members are welcome to attend. At the next meeting, APS's architects plan to present four concept plans for the BLPC to discuss. The BLPC will then choose one concept plan to recommend to the school board. The School Board and County Board will each need to approve a final design.
