CCA General Meeting Wed, 9/21/16, 7:30 pm at Cherrydale VFD The next step is CCA approval to send the project to Arlington's Neighborhood Conservation Advisory Committee. Quebec St., which is directly across from Oak Grove Park, and victim of speeding cars, has no sidewalk on either side of the road. The CCA vote to send to NCAC will take place at the September 21st meeting at the historic firehouse on Lee Hwy. Please come out and show your support for this important project.

Thank You Volunteers!

This is a heads up to Cherrydalers about the success this summer of a Cherrydale tree watering bucket brigade and a thank you to the members of the squad.

The site is the steep embankment between the bike trail and Duck Pond shoreline. This embankment was cleared of vines and debris by a small volunteer group in late February during a winter cleanup of Hidden Pond/Cherry Valley and Duck Pond parks.

Arlington Master Naturalist Beth Kiser offered bare root trees and shrubs for the site, and it

was meticulously cleared over the next few weeks. Another volunteer party on April 2nd planted nearly 40 trees, shrubs, and shoreline grasses. It was intentionally over-planted with the expectation of substantial losses. To date, the only casualty is one Spice Bush. There are also several healthy local saplings.



- The county is ready to unveil its concept plan for the Monroe Street NC project to affected homeowners (between 17th St. and 19th St. and also includes a portion of 19th St with no sidewalk). This presentation is exclusively for those with property on these blocks. If your home is within this zone and you did not receive meeting information please contact block captain, Rosey ONeil or Cherrydale NC Rep harry.spector@gmail.com. If the concept meets homeowners' expectations the project should get a recommendation for funding at the December NC funding round and approval by the County Board in February 2017. The project will give pedestrians a wider, unobstructed walking path as well as add streetlights.
- The 20th Street (between Kenmore and Monroe) NC project, which was essentially a rebuild of the entire, with full depth paving and some realignment, new sidewalk, and streetlights, is all but officially completed.



It's a huge

improvement for homeowners and pedestrians, and while the construction was not fun to endure, the results should be enjoyed for some time to come.
